## Curriculum Highlights

Language Arts: Students are exposed to literature in varied genres. Students sharpen analytical and critical thinking skills, viewing literature through multiple lenses. They practice employing these skills in real-world situations. Written Expression, focuses on narrative, argumentative, and expository writing. There is emphasis on grammar and sentence structure as well as mechanics and usage.

Math: Saint Rose offers three mathematics options for 8th graders. The first option is the standard 8th Grade curriculum, which continues the prior-year's curriculum with a heavy emphasis on Algebra. An Algebra course is also offered, as well as the third option, which is a second-level high school math course.


Science: The 8<sup>th</sup> Grade curriculum includes many exciting topics, such as forces and motion, species reproduction and genetics, as well as the earth changing processes and geologic time.

Social Studies: Beginning with the colonization of America by the British and the French, the curriculum delves into the causes of the Revolution, the Revolution itself, and the establishment of the Republic. The 8<sup>th</sup> Grade curriculum continues through the Civil War.

Religion: Major topics in the 8th grade curriculum include: Church History, social justice, prayer, and Theology of the Body. Saint Rose School prepares Catholic eighth graders for the sacrament of Confirmation. The students develop action plans to address a societal issue and carry out service to help build the Kingdom of God on earth.

The 8th grade students research national monuments and then take a class trip to Washington D.C.

Students in Grades K-8 take the Measurement of Academic Performance (MAP) evaluations. Saint Rose School students score consistently higher than their peers in the Diocese of Toledo and across the United States.
