Sixth Grade Curriculum Highlights

Language Arts: Students are offered a variety of reading experiences covering all genres. Novels include *The True Confessions of Charlotte Doyle* and *Ink Heart*. There is a focus on written expression, as well as mechanics, grammar and sentence structure.


Math: Sixth grade mathematics includes a review and extension on number sense topics with an emphasis on ratio. The course introduces algebra concepts and statistics and builds upon earlier foundations in geometry.

Science: This course introduces our middle school science curriculum with hands-on lab experiences, which help students to navigate through earth, physical, and life science.

Social Studies: Sixth grade focuses on the ancient world, surveying prehistory and the major river civilizations. In addition to the history portion of the course, the curriculum focus on the unique geographic, economic, and political aspects of these cultures, especially investigating how they impact people today.

Religion: The focus in this class is the Old Testament and the revelation of God's plan through the Israelites. This in-depth curriculum studies the responsibilities of Catholics, including building an informed conscience, the call for solidarity, and service to the community.

Sixth grade students scored higher on the Measurement of Academic Performance Tests than the national and diocesan averages in all subject areas.



Seventh Grade Curriculum Highlights

Language Arts: Students are offered a variety of reading experiences. There is a focus on written expression, including expository, narrative, and persuasive writing. Students also work on grammar and usage skills.


Math: Seventh grade mathematics includes geometry, measurement, integer operations, and algebra. Our accelerated seventh grade mathematics class provides students a combined seventh/eighth grade curriculum, and we also offer a high school level class for our highly motivated students.

Science: This course engages students in project-based learning, while studying the cycles and conservation of matter and energy, as well as cycles and patterns of the earth and moon.

Social Studies: Beginning with ancient Greece and Rome and then following major historical development, the seventh grade curriculum highlights themes including increased globalization, the roots of American democracy, and economic reasons for exploration.

Religion: The seventh grade curriculum examines the New Testament in depth, working with all four gospels to study Jesus' mission and analyze His words. This course explores the Acts of the Apostles and inspects the formative days of the Catholic Church through the trials of St. Paul.

Seventh Grade students scored higher on the Measurement of Academic Performance Tests than the national and diocesan averages in all subject areas.



Eighth Grade Curriculum

Language Arts: Students are offered reading experiences in a wide variety of genres. Novels for this course include *The Book Thief* and *The Giver*. Written expression focuses on narrative and expository writing. There is emphasis on grammar and sentence structure as well as mechanics and usage.

Math: Saint Rose offers three mathematics options for eighth graders. The main eighth grade curriculum continues the prior-year's curriculum with a heavy emphasis on algebra. Mrs. Cichocki teaches an algebra course as well as the third option, which is second-level high school math course.

Science: The eighth grade curriculum includes many exciting topics, such as forces and motion, species reproduction and genetics, as well as the earth changing processes and geologic time.

Social Studies: Beginning with the colonization of America by the British and the French, the curriculum delves into the causes of the Revolution, the Revolution itself, and the set-up of the Republic. The eighth grade curriculum continues through the Civil War.

Religion: The eighth grade curriculum includes three major topics: Church history, sacraments, and social justice. Saint Rose School prepares Catholic eighth graders for the sacrament of confirmation. Religion includes an emphasis on service. The students develop action plan and carry out service to help build the Kingdom of God on earth.
